

# Discipline Procedure Laguna Madre Christian Academy

The procedure outlines below established generally how, when and why discipline will be administered at Laguna Madre Christian Academy.

Circumstances that may precipitate discipline: Undesirable behaviors as listed in the LMCA Parent Manual, or other equally inappropriate behaviors or actions, in the judgment of the director, may constitute cause for discipline. In as much as is practical and appropriate given the type and severity of the offensive student behavior, academy staff will follow a progressive discipline procedure seeking to employ the minimum action necessary to correct and end the offensive behavior. However, this is not to say that each step must occur prior to the decision to administer discipline. These steps are:

- 1. Verbal reprimand directly to student
- 2. Time out punishment
- 3. Written note to parent explaining the problem
- 4. Parent conference (telephone or personal)
- 5. Suspension (in-school or off campus)
- 6. Restitution
- 7. Expulsion

**Director's Decision:** It shall be the decision of the LMCA director as to when discipline is needed, after prayerful consideration of the offensive behavior, the child's past behavior, the severity of the offense, the teacher's recommendation, and the likelihood that the discipline will correct the behavior. In most circumstances, the director will allow an appropriate "cooling off" period after the offense and before making a final decision that discipline is warranted.

**Parent Responsibility:** It is the parent's responsibility to support the discipline procedure, Steps 1 through 7, when the discipline has been deemed necessary. Parents may not give a "blanket release" to discipline whenever deemed necessary, but will instead be notified each time prior to administration of discipline.

### Parental Agreement Laguna Madre Christian Academy

- Philosophy By signing this parental agreement, we have read the Statement of Faith and understand that Laguna Madre Christian Academy will adhere to that statement in all student actions.
- ❖ Parental Involvement We understand that the philosophy of the school cannot be fulfilled without parental involvement. Participation in Laguna Madre Christian Academy's Parent Support Program is required. This involvement shall include, but not be limited to: Participation in fund raising activities, attendance at school functions and parent meetings, support of the homework policy, reading information sent home from school, and communication with your child's teacher(s). We further understand that in today's complex society certain circumstances could arise in which school authorities reasonably determine that a child's attendance at the school poses an unacceptable security risk to the school. If such a determination is made the school may require an immediate withdrawal of that family.
- ❖ <u>Discipline and Conduct</u> The school shall have authority to require our child to comply with all school policies as contained in the Parent/Student Handbook. We agree that we will fully cooperate with the school in maintaining the highest standards of civility for our child. We further understand that the decision of the director in all matters of student discipline is final.
- ❖ <u>Damages</u> We will pay for damages caused by our child.
- **Activities** We give permission for our child to participate in all school activities.
- Liability We release Laguna Madre Christian Academy for all liability, except negligence, while our child is under school care and responsibility.
- Placement We understand that the school has full discretion in the class placement of our child and the school pledges to work closely with the parents in this placement.
- Dress Code We agree to support the school's dress code. (Please refer to the Parent/Student Handbook and the Uniform Policy.)
- Grievances We pledge our loyalty to the aims and ideal of the school and will bring any and all questions and concerns directly to the appropriate teacher so they may be properly considered by those in authority. Further questions and concerns are resolved using the Matthew 18 policy as written in the Parent/Student Handbook.
- **Financial Agreement** We agree to fulfill all financial obligations promptly. We understand that tuition payment is to be made in compliance with the tuition plans offered.
- ❖ Withdrawal We agree that should we choose to withdraw our child during the year, we will make an appointment with the school office to sign the proper withdrawal forms. Because of the year long commitment Laguna Madre Christian Academy must make to a teacher's salary and because of the need to purchase many instructional materials for students, each family IS RESPONSIBLE FOR A FULL YEAR'S TUITION IF THEIR CHILD(REN) IS/ARE WITHDRAWN FOR ANY REASONS whether by action of the parents or by action of the school authorities.

### There are four exceptions to this policy:

- If the school be found guilty of negligence in a court of competent jurisdiction or through and agreed upon arbitration process and should the parents decide to withdraw their children from the school as a consequence, the school shall require that the parents pay tuition only through the end of the month in which such withdrawal occurred.
- 2. If the family moves from the Valley or more than 20 miles from the assigned Laguna Madre Christian Academy campus, tuition is payable only through the month in which the withdrawal occurred.

3.	Regardless of the reason for withdrawal within a given school year, when a new student takes the seat of a
	withdrawn student a pro-rated tuition credit will be given to the withdrawn family.

4.	Each student is accepted on a probationary period. If at anytime during this period (60 school days) the
	director or parent may deem that LMCA and the student are not a good fit for one another the student may
	he released from the contract.

# Uniform Policy Laguna Madre Christian Academy

A student's worth or acceptance should not be based on their economic background or whether they have submitted themselves to the latest trend. Yet we see our youth placing far too much emphasis on their outward appearance rather than the inward heart.

We believe what is important for our students is the business of learning, the way they treat others, the choices they make, and their distinctive Christian character. Propriety and modesty in dress are essential to our testimony.

A uniform policy will not be the answer to all situations that arise in our school, but it will help teach our children that this is an atmosphere where there is a respect for each other and of authority. What Laguna Madre Christian Academy desires is that we provide an excellent education and help nurture Godly character in our students.

The following is the <u>required</u> uniform dress-code for Laguna Madre Christian Academy. You may remove this portion of the application package to keep for your reference. The Student Handbook and LMCA Application are also available to view at any time on our website: www.lmcatexas.com

The required daily uniforms may be purchased at any store, but it is very important that they are purchased in the <u>UNIFORM DEPARTMENT ONLY</u>. Junior and adult sizes are available at J. C. Penny, Sears, Lands End, Academy, Target, Old Navy, The Children's Place and WalMart stores. If junior and adult sizes are purchased outside the uniform department, they must strictly conform to the uniform policy. Please review the policy carefully. The Formal uniform shirt MUST be purchased from Team Graphix in Los Fesnos.

- P.E. students are not required to have a special uniform for their P.E. classes.
- P.E. Girls must wear solid uniform color shorts under their skirts or jumpers.

**IMPORTANT:** The parent or guardian will be contacted by phone to either bring clothing to correct a uniform infraction or to pick up the student. Students not complying with the following standards will not be allowed to attend class.

### **Girls Grooming and Uniform Standards**

#### **Personal Grooming**

- Hair should be clean and worn neatly combed out of the eyes.
- **\*** Extreme hair styles or colors are not permitted.
- Temporary or permanent tattoos are not permitted.

#### **Accessories**

- Hair accessory colors must not be extreme in style or be a distraction in class.
- ❖ Jewelry must be minimal and safe to wear during PE. No facial piercings allowed.
- Minimal make-up with natural hues.

#### **Girls Formal Uniform**

This uniform MUST be worn each **WEDNESDAY** for Chapel, on select field trips, and on any other designated "Formal Uniform Days."

#### The SHIRT MUST be purchased at Team Graphix in Los Fresnos.

- ❖ Pre-Approved NAVY polo style shirt with the school logo embroidered on the left side.
- Pair with khaki skirt, shorts or slacks. Hems should fall no shorter than 3" above the knee.
- Colored shirts may NOT be worn on Chapel days.

#### **Additional Requirements for Girls Formal Uniform**

- **Sweater:** Solid navy cardigan.
- **Hosiery**: White opaque, red, or navy tights may be worn in cold weather. Solid navy, white,red,or black leggings will be allowed on cold weather days ONLY (below 60 degrees).
- NO PRINTS OR PATTERNS on leggings or tights is allowed.
- **Shoes:** must be close-toed. NO sandals, flip flops, Crocs, or boots allowed.
- Solid colored shorts (navy, white, red or black) MUST be worn under skirts.

#### **Girls Daily Uniform Options**

The following may be purchased through Sears, JC Penny, Target, Wal-Mart or other discount stores provided they comply with standard uniform colors, quality and standards.

- Skirts/Skorts: Navy or khaki. Hems may not fall more than 3 inches above the top of the kneecap.
- Shorts: Navy/Khaki shorts. Hems may not fall more than 3 inches above the top of the kneecap.
- Pants: Navy/Khaki pleated or plain front pant. No stretchy, knit or spandex material.
- Shirts: Solid forest green, red, white, soft yellow or navy knit, collared polo-type shirt.
- ❖ Blouse: White long sleeve button-up blouse or solid forest green, red, white, soft yellow or navy knit, collared long sleeve polo-type shirt or turtleneck may be worn in cold weather.
- Sweater: solid-colored cardigans in navy, red, white, or black.
- Sweatshirt: Non-hooded solid crew, v-neck, or zipped front sweatshirts in navy, red, white, or black.
- **Hosiery**: White opaque, red, or navy tights may be worn in cold weather. Solid navy, white,red,or black leggings will be allowed on cold weather days ONLY (below 60 degrees).
- NO PRINTS OR PATTERNS on leggings or tights is allowed.
- Shoes: must be close-toed and with a school-appropriate theme. NO sandals, flip flops, Crocs, or boots.

- Boots (including ankle boots) are allowed on Fridays provided they do not interfere with PE.
- Solid colored shorts (navy, white, red or black) MUST be worn under skirts.
- FRIDAYS ONLY: denim jeans or denim shorts (no frayed hems, no holes) may be worn with an LMCA "spirit" shirt or any uniform shirt.
- ❖ Shirts, blouses and dresses at school or any school functions including school pictures MUST HAVE SLEEVES. The sleeves must be at least 2-3 inches below the shoulder seam. Spring sweaters may be worn over sleeveless items provided the sweater is not removed at any time during the school function.

### **Boys Grooming and Uniform Standards**

#### **Personal Grooming**

- Hair should be neatly groomed and maintained. It should be kept off the collar, eyebrows, and mid-ear. Extreme hair styles and colors are not permitted.
- Longer hair must still adhere to the above standards and must be pulled completely and neatly back into a single hair elastic.
- Earrings and facial piercings are not allowed.
- Temporary or permanent tattoos are not permitted.
- No facial hair.

#### **Boys Formal Uniform**

This uniform MUST be worn each **WEDNESDAY** for Chapel, on select field trips, and on any other designated "Formal Uniform Days."

#### The SHIRT MUST be purchased at Team Graphix in Los Fresnos.

- ❖ Pre-Approved NAVY polo style shirt with the school logo embroidered on the left side.
- Pair with KHAKI shorts or slacks. Hems should fall no shorter than 3" above the knee.
- Colored shirts may NOT be worn on Chapel days.

#### **Additional Requirements for Boys Formal Uniform**

- Pants: Navy pleated or plain front full length pants worn with regulation belt.
- Sweater: Solid navy Cardigan
- Shoes: No flip flops, water shoes, sandals, Crocs, Heelys, or lighted tennis shoes may be worn. Tennis shoes must have a school- appropriate theme.
- ❖ BOOTS (including ankle boots) MAY BE WORN ON FRIDAYS ONLY, provided they do not interfere with PE
- ❖ Belt: Regulation belt, brown or black leather, must be worn on Chapel days by students in grades 1 and above. K3-K5 will not be required to wear belts.

#### **Boy's Daily Uniform Options**

- Shorts: Navy/Khaki shorts. Hems may not fall more than 3 inches above the top of the kneecap.
- Pants: Navy/Khaki pleated or plain front full length pants.
- Shirts: Solid forest green, soft yellow, red, white or navy knit, collared polo-type shirt. Solid forest green, soft yellow, red, white, soft yellow or navy knit, collared, longsleeve polo-type shirt or turtleneck may be worn in cold weather.
- Sweatshirt: Non-hooded solid navy, red, white or black crew or V-neck may be worn.
- Vest: A solid navy vest may be worn.

- Shoes: No flip flops, sandals, water shoes, Crocs, Heelys, or lighted tennis shoes may be worn. Shoes must be closed-toed. Tennis shoes must be Christian school appropriate with an appropriate theme.
- **❖** BOOTS (including ankle boots) MAY BE WORN ON FRIDAYS ONLY.

#### Jean Day

Each Friday will be Jean Day for all students. Students must still wear a school uniform shirt or school T-shirts with their jeans. Jeans/shorts must be blue or khaki with NO holes or frayed hems. **Jeans must be solid in color-no prints allowed.** Shorts must be no more than 3 inches above the knee, measured from the kneecap. Boots may be worn.

#### "No-Uniform Day Passes"

<u>Passes may not be used on Chapel Day.</u> School appropriate clothing and shoes only. No sleeveless or see-through blouses, no tank-tops, no overalls, no short-shorts. No light-up shoes, no flip-flops, or sandals. Please turn your pass in to your teacher upon arriving at school.
